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## RIBBONS AND PRIZES

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Ribbons will be presented 1<sup>st</sup> through 8<sup>th</sup> place in each class.

Stakes class prize money to 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> only when there are 6 or more entries. 1<sup>st</sup> - \$50, 2<sup>nd</sup> - \$30 and 3<sup>rd</sup> - \$20.

Division & Reserve Championship ribbons will presented at each show.

### Blue Star Year End Champions

A Year End Champion and Reserve Champion will be determined by total accumulated points awarded during the 2017 BRONZE Hunter Jumper Series. All points towards a championship will be allocated to the rider who must attend all 3 shows to qualify for year end points.

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## OFFICIAL EQUESTRIAN CANADA STATEMENT OF PRINCIPLES

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### Statement of Principles

Equestrian Canada (EC), the national equestrian federation of Canada, supports adherence to the humane treatment of horses in all activities under its jurisdiction.

All Persons shall be committed to:

- upholding the welfare of all horses, regardless of value, as a primary consideration in all activities;
- requiring that horses be treated with kindness, respect and compassion, and that they never be subjected to mistreatment;
- ensuring that all Equestrians including owners, trainers and competitors, or their respective agents, use responsible care in the handling, treatment and transportation of their own horses as well as horses placed in their care for any purpose;
- providing for the continuous well-being of horses by encouraging routine inspection and consultation with health care professionals and competition officials to achieve the highest possible standards of nutrition, health, comfort and safety as a matter of standard operating procedure;
- providing current information on Code of Practice for the Care and Handling of Equines and other equine health and welfare initiatives;
- continuing to support scientific studies on equine health and welfare;
- requiring owners, trainers and competitors to know and follow their sanctioning organization's rules, and to work within industry regulations in all equestrian competitions; and
- actively promoting the development of and adherence to competition rules and regulations that protect the welfare of the horse.

The standard by which conduct or treatment will be measured is that which a person who is informed and experienced in generally accepted equine training and competition procedures would determine to be neither cruel, abusive, nor inhumane.

**Per Article A801**, every entry at an EC sanctioned competition shall constitute an agreement by the person responsible that the owner, lessee, trainer, manager, agent, coach, driver or rider and horse shall be subject to the EC constitution and all rules of EC and any additional rules set by the competition. It is the responsibility of all individuals participating in any capacity in EC sanctioned competitions to be knowledgeable regarding the EC constitution and the applicable rules of EC and the additional rules, if any, imposed by the competition. Do not participate in this EC sanctioned competition in any capacity if you do not consent to be bound by the constitution and rules of EC and any additional rules imposed by the competition.

NOTE: Any horse entered in any class at these competitions may be selected for equine medication control testing while at the event location.

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## RULES AND REGULATIONS

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We respectfully ask that you observe the following considerations while on Blue Star property to ensure the safety, well-being and enjoyment of all spectators and competitors:

**Person Responsible** The Person Responsible (PR) for a horse must be an adult who has, or shares responsibility for the care, training, custody and performance of the horse and who has official responsibility for that horse under EC rules. The PR is liable under the penalty provisions of the applicable EC rules for any rule violations. Every entry form for an EC sanctioned competition must identify the PR and be signed by the PR. PR must be an EC Sport License holder in good standing OR in the case of a junior/minor owner entries, a parent/guardians entitled to sign.

- 1) All riders and owners must be current members of the OEF and EC (Bronze level membership). PLEASE PROVIDE COPIES WITH YOUR ENTRY.
- 2) All entries must be paid before the start of the class. Open cheques are welcome and recommended. We will calculate and balance invoices when closing entries. A receipt will be provided on closing. A \$40 charge will be applied on all NSF cheques received.
- 3) All competitors and non-showing horses must register and display a number at all times whilst at the venue.
- 4) If scratching from a class, please ensure that the show office knows and that you give us at least one class notice. A refund less the administrative fee will only be provided upon receipt of a veterinary certificate and at the discretion of the Show Manager.
- 5) It is understood that ALL riders must wear an ASTM/SEI or BSI/BS EN approved helmet. If a rider does not meet this requirement, he/she will not be allowed to compete at these competitions. See Rules of Equine Canada A905 Headgear.
- 6) All trainers, coaches etc., must sign a BSF waiver of responsibility before mounting any horse for any reason unless they are registered as a competitor. Please check in with the Show Office if the need arises.
- 8) Any horse entered in any class at these competitions may be selected for equine medication control testing while at the event location.
- 9) All dogs and children must be under control at all times. The poop-and-scoop rule is in effect. Dogs must be leashed at all times. Under no circumstances should dogs be left unattended in your vehicle at any time.
- 10) Water and washrooms are provided for your convenience. Please help us keep these areas clean.
- 11) Parking areas have been designated on the attached facilities map. Limited car and handicapped parking is available by the arena. Trailer turn-around for stabling drop off only in this area. All Trailer parking is located behind the show facilities and accessed through the farm entrance. **SPEED 10 mph. Please use caution as horse and riders will be sharing this access area.**
- 12) Blue Star Farm owners, management and volunteers are in no way responsible for any loss, damage or injury to animals, property or persons. Competitors and spectators are on the property at their own risk. Please do not leave unattended vehicles unlocked.
- 13) If you have any suggestions to the improvement of our show, please direct them to show management only. We welcome your constructive comments.

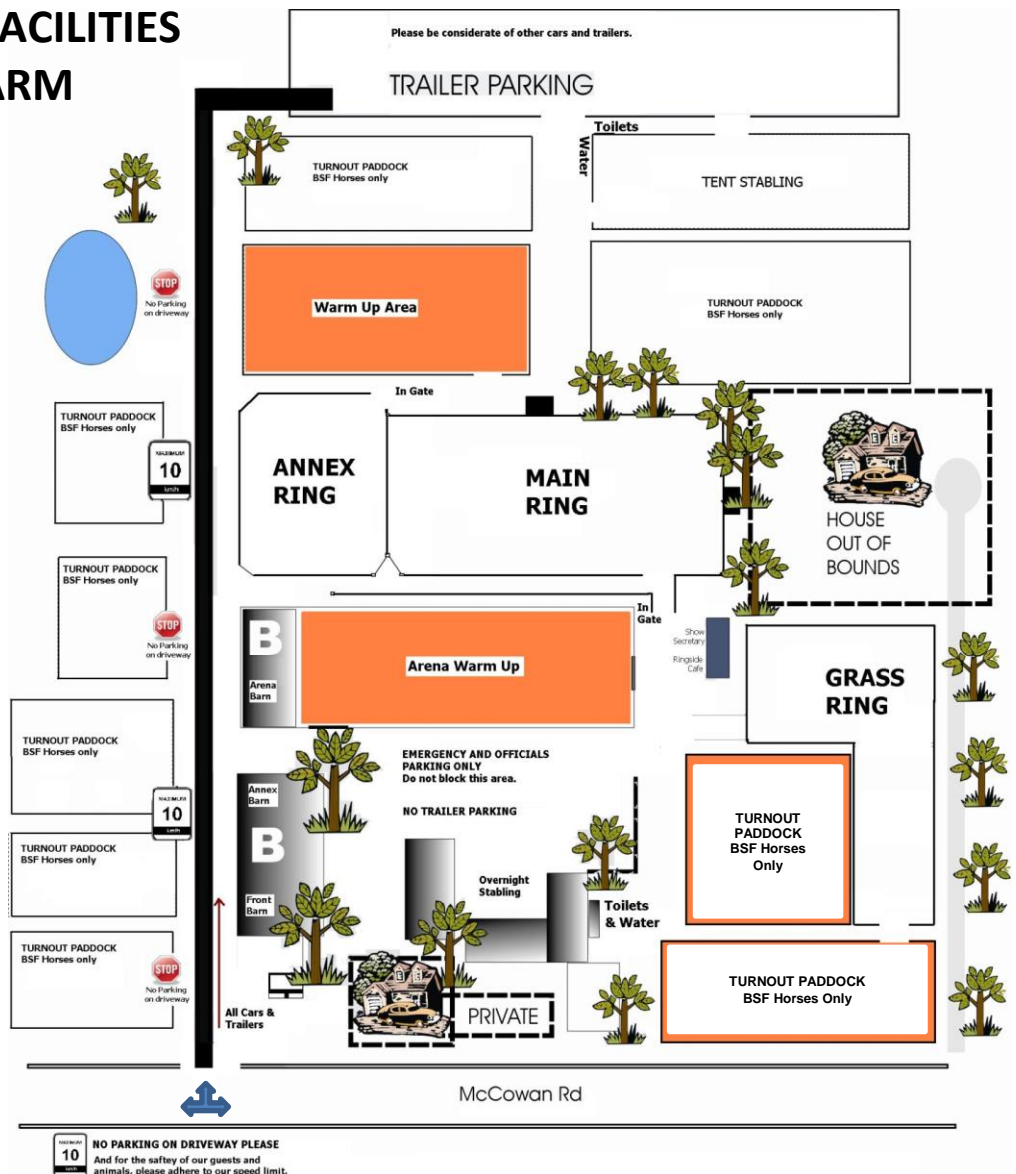
